

## 2024/25 CBOC Test

1. Shall teams shoot at the same basket in overtime as they did in the fourth quarter?  
YES Article 9.6
2. A1 fouls B1. Coach A disagrees and enters the court and yells at the referee. Shall coach A be charged with a technical foul?  
YES Article 36.2.1
3. A1 has the ball for a throw-in and attempts to pass the ball to A2. B2 jumps from the Team B frontcourt intercepts the pass while airborne and lands in the Team B backcourt. Is this a backcourt violation by B2?  
NO Article 30.1.2
4. A1 is fouled by B1 in the Team A backcourt with 21 seconds on the shot clock. This is the fourth Team B foul of the quarter. Coach B is then assessed a technical foul. How shall play resume?
  - a) One free throw for Team A / Backcourt throw-in for Team A / 24 seconds on the shot clock
  - b) One free throw for Team A / Backcourt throw-in for Team A / 21 seconds on the shot clock
  - c) One free throw for Team A / Backcourt throw-in for Team A / 4 seconds on the shot clockA Article 36.3.2, 50.3
5. A1 is dribbling towards the Team B basket and charges into B1 who is standing with one foot touching the no-charge semi-circle. The contact occurs on B1's torso. The referee calls a team control foul on A1. Is this correct?  
YES Interpretation 33.3
6. A1 jumps with the ball and the ball is legally blocked by B1. The ball does not leave A1's hands A1 returns to the floor with two hands firmly on the ball. B1 is no longer touching the ball. Is this a jump ball situation?

7. After A1's try for goal is released the game clock signal sounds to end the quarter. B1 then touches the ball on its upward flight. The ball enters the basket. Shall the goal count?

8. With 1:45 remaining in the fourth quarter, A4 has the ball in their hands for a throw-in at location A when B2 fouls A2 at location X. After the free throw, what is the location of the throw-in for Team A?

9. The referee blows their whistle and gives the time-out signal. Shall the timer start their stopwatch immediately?

10. A5's throw-in passes through the Team B basket directly without having been touched by a player on the playing court. Shall another throw-in be awarded to Team A from the same throw-in spot?

11. A1 starts a dribble by throwing the ball over the head of B1. The ball touches the court and then A1 continues to dribble. Is this a legal play?  
YES Interpretation 24.6
12. A1 ends their dribble in the backcourt and is closely guarded by B2. After holding the ball for five seconds, the referee calls a violation on A1. Is this correct?  
YES Article 27.1, 27.2 Interpretation 27.2
13. Is the timer responsible for informing the referee when a player has been charged with five fouls?  
YES Article 49.1
14. B2 has established a legal guarding position on A1. A1 contacts B2 in the torso and A1 is charged with a team control foul. This is the fifth Team A's foul of the quarter. Shall B2 be awarded two free throws?  
NO Article 41.2.2
15. A1 and B1 commit technical fouls against one another at approximately the same time. Is this considered a double foul?  
NO Article 35.1.2, 35.2, Interpretation 35.2
16. A1 is assessed an unsportsmanlike foul against B1. After the free throws, shall the throw-in be taken at the throw-in line in the frontcourt opposite the scorer's table?  
YES Article 17.2.7
17. A1 releases the ball on a shot from the three-point field goal area. On its upward flight the ball is touched by B2 who is standing in the two-point field goal area. The ball enters the basket. Shall team A be awarded three points?  
YES Article 16.2.1, 16.2
18. Dribbler A1 is charged with a technical foul. Substitute B6 requests to enter the game to attempt the free throw for the technical foul. Shall the request be granted?  
YES Interpretation 18/19.13
19. Team B scores a field goal. While holding the ball out-of-bounds for the throw-in, A1 steps on the endline but not over the inside edge of the endline. Is this a violation by A1?  
NO Article 2.1, 17.3.1
20. A1 is holding the ball. A1 then falls to the court and slides. Is this a travelling violation?  
NO Article 25.2.2, Interpretation 25.2(b)

21. The game is stopped because of an injury to A1. Team B is granted a time-out. During the time-out A1 recovers and is ready to play. Shall A1 be permitted to remain in the game?  
YES Article 5.7, Interpretation 5.15(a)

22. A6 is at the scorer's table and has requested to substitute for A1. After the game clock is stopped for a violation, the referee gives the substitution signal as shown below with no further signal.



Is this the end of the substitution procedure which permits A6 to become a player and A1 to become a substitute?

23. Is the centre line part of the frontcourt?

24. With 53 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, A1 has the ball at their disposal for a throw-in when B2 fouls A2. Shall this foul automatically be deemed an unsportsmanlike foul?

25. A1 is dribbling the ball in the backcourt when a held ball occurs between A1 and B1. The possession arrow favours Team A. Shall Team A have a new 8 seconds to cause the ball to move to the frontcourt?

26. Shall the first assistant coach be permitted to go to the scorer's table to obtain statistical information when the ball is dead and the game clock is stopped?

YES Article 7.4

27. A1 begins the act of shooting and is fouled by B1. Instead of attempting a try for goal, A1 passes the ball to A2. This is the third Team B foul of the quarter. Shall A1 be awarded two free throws?

NO Article 15.1.6, Interpretation 15.8

28. The game clock shows 2.5 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter. After the ball leaves A1's hands on the throw-in, B1 is the first to deliberately contact the ball with their leg. The referee indicates a violation by B1 and awards a Team A throw-in out of bounds nearest to where the violation occurred with 2.5 seconds on the game clock. Is this correct?

29. A3 has been in the restricted area for three seconds. A3 steps out of bounds with both feet to avoid a three-second violation and then re-enters the restricted area. Shall the referee call a three-second violation on A3?  
YES Article 26.1.3, Interpretation 26.2
30. With 1:45 remaining in the fourth quarter, Team A is awarded a backcourt throw-in on the sideline near the Team A bench. Team A is granted a time-out. After the time-out, coach A requests that the throw-in take place in the frontcourt. Shall the throw-in take place at the throw-in line in the Team A frontcourt opposite the scorer's table?  
NO Article 17.2.4, Interpretation 17.13, 17.14
31. A1 begins the act of shooting when B2 fouls A2. This is Team B's third foul of the quarter. A1 in a continuous motion releases the ball which enters the basket. The referee counts the basket and awards a throw-in to Team A nearest to where the foul occurred. Is this correct?  
YES Article 10.4, Interpretation 10.2
32. Near the end of the shot clock period, A4's pass from the frontcourt is missed by A5 and the ball rolls into Team A's backcourt. Before B4 gains control of the ball, with a free path to the basket, the shot clock signal sounds. B4 then gains immediate and clear control of the ball. The referee disregards the signal and allows play to continue without interruption. Is this correct?

33. Team A scores a basket with 2:02 remaining in the fourth quarter. B1 is out of bounds with the ball when the clock reaches 2:00. Shall the referee instruct the timer to stop the clock at this time?

34. A1 and B1 start a fight on the court in the team B backcourt. Team A manager enters the court and participates in the fight. How shall play resume?  
a) Two free throws for any Team B player / Frontcourt throw-in for Team B / 14 seconds on the shot clock  
b) Two free throws for any Team B player / Frontcourt throw-in for Team B / 24 seconds on the shot clock  
c) Four free throws for any Team B player / Frontcourt throw-in for Team B / 14 seconds on the shot clock

35. B2 fouls dribbler A5. This is the sixth Team B foul in the quarter. A5 then throws the ball directly at B2's head. The referee charges B2 with a personal foul and A5 with a disqualifying foul. How shall play resume?  
a) A5 shoots two free throws / Any Team B player shoots two free throws / Team B throw-in at the throw-in line in the frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock  
b) A5's substitute shoots two free throws / Any Team B player shoots two free throws / Team B throw-in at the throw-in line in the frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock  
c) No free throws are awarded / Team B throw-in at the throw-in line in the frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock

36. With 5 seconds remaining on the shot clock, A1 throws the ball towards the ring to reset the shot clock. The ball hits the ring and is then touched by B3 before going out of bounds in the Team A backcourt. Shall Team A be awarded a throw-in in their backcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock?  
YES Article 29.2.7, Interpretation 29/50.40
37. Team A has all three time-outs remaining in the second half. With 2:04 remaining in the fourth quarter, coach A requests a time-out at the next opportunity. Team B scores a field goal and the clock is stopped with 1:58 remaining in the fourth quarter. Team A is granted a time-out. After the time-out, does Team A still have two time-outs remaining in the fourth quarter?

38. After A1's last free throw, the ball rebounds from the ring. B1 accidentally taps the ball so that it enters the basket. The referees award Team A one point. Is this correct?

39. A1 is in the act of shooting in the restricted area when B1 is charged with an unsportsmanlike foul against A1. The ball enters the basket. The Team B coach is then charged with a technical foul. The referees count the basket. How shall play resume?  
a) One free throw for any Team A player / One free throw for A1 / Throw-in for Team A at the throw-in line in the Team A frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock  
b) One free throw for A1 / One free throw for any Team A player / Throw-in for Team A at the throw-in line in the Team A frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock  
c) One free throw for any Team A player / One free throw for A1 / Throw-in for Team A on the endline in the Team A frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock

40. The crew chief tosses the ball for the opening jump ball. Before the ball reaches its highest point, non-jumper A4 enters the circle from their backcourt. The referee calls a violation on A4 and awards Team B a throw-in at the centre line with 24 seconds on the shot clock. Is the referee correct?  
NO Article 12.2.8, Interpretation 12.4
41. A1 releases the ball for their final unsuccessful free throw. After the ball hits the ring but while the ball is in the air, A3 and B3 are charged with a double foul. The possession arrow favours Team B. Shall Team B be awarded a throw-in nearest to where the double foul occurred?  
YES Article 35.2, Interpretation 35.5
42. A1 attempts a field goal. The ball hits the ring and is bouncing directly above the ring when B1 causes the ring to vibrate in such a way that the ball does not take an unnatural bounce or change direction. The ball does not enter the basket. Is this basket interference?  
NO Article 31.2.4, Interpretation 31.17

43. With 4:52 remaining in the fourth quarter, A2 is fouled by B1 while in the act of shooting. The try for goal is unsuccessful. The referees direct A1 to the free throw line to attempt two free throws. After the first successful free throw the error is discovered. The referee cancels the free throw by A1 and permits A2 to shoot two free throws. Is this correct?  
YES Article 44.4.4, Interpretation 44.4, 44.16
44. B1 is charged with a personal foul for pushing A1. At approximately the same time, A1 is charged with an unsportsmanlike foul for hitting B1 with their elbow. Is this a double foul?  
NO Interpretation 35.7
45. The game clock signal sounds to end the fourth quarter with the score tied and the possession arrow favouring Team A. During the interval of play between the fourth quarter and the first overtime, A1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul against B1. After B1's free throws, shall the overtime start with a throw-in for Team B at the throw-in line in the frontcourt with 14 seconds on the shot clock?  
YES Article 37.2.2, Interpretation 17.27
46. B1 fouls A1 on a successful two-point field goal. A1 is then assessed a technical foul. The referee awards one free throw to any Team B player followed by one free throw for A1. Is this correct?  
NO Interpretation 42.5
47. Team A has already been warned about faking a foul. B1 is defending dribbler A1. B1 pushes A1 and A1 makes a sudden move with the head trying to give the impression that they were fouled by B1. The referee calls a foul on B1. Shall the referee also charge A1 with a technical foul?  
YES Interpretation 36.14
48. During A1's final free throw while the ball is above the level of the ring but before the ball has touched the ring, B1 reaches through the basket from below and touches the ball. The referee counts the free throw, awards one point to A1 and resumes play with a Team B throw-in on the endline. Is this correct?  
NO Article 31.2.3, 36.2.1, Interpretation 31.2
49. A2's frontcourt throw-in is simultaneously touched by A1 and B1 before bouncing in the Team A backcourt. A3 is the first to touch the ball in the Team A backcourt. Is this a backcourt violation by Team A?  
YES Interpretation 30.11
50. Dribbler A1 is fouled by B1. This is B1's fifth foul and the second Team B foul in the quarter. While going to the Team B bench, B1 pushes A1 and then A1 pushes B1. The referee charges A1 and B1 with unsportsmanlike fouls, cancels the penalties and resumes play with a throw-in for Team A. Is this correct?
